

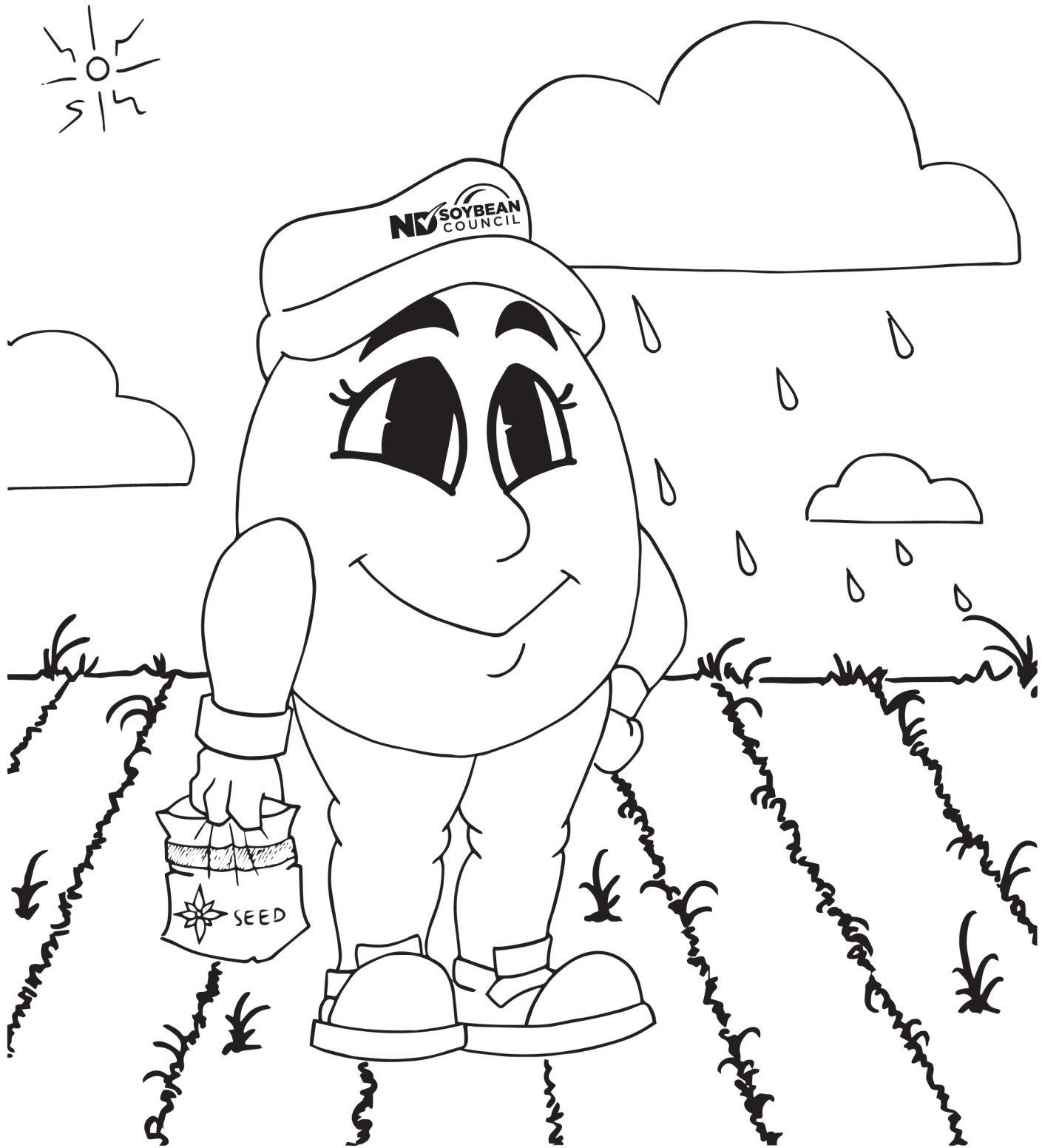

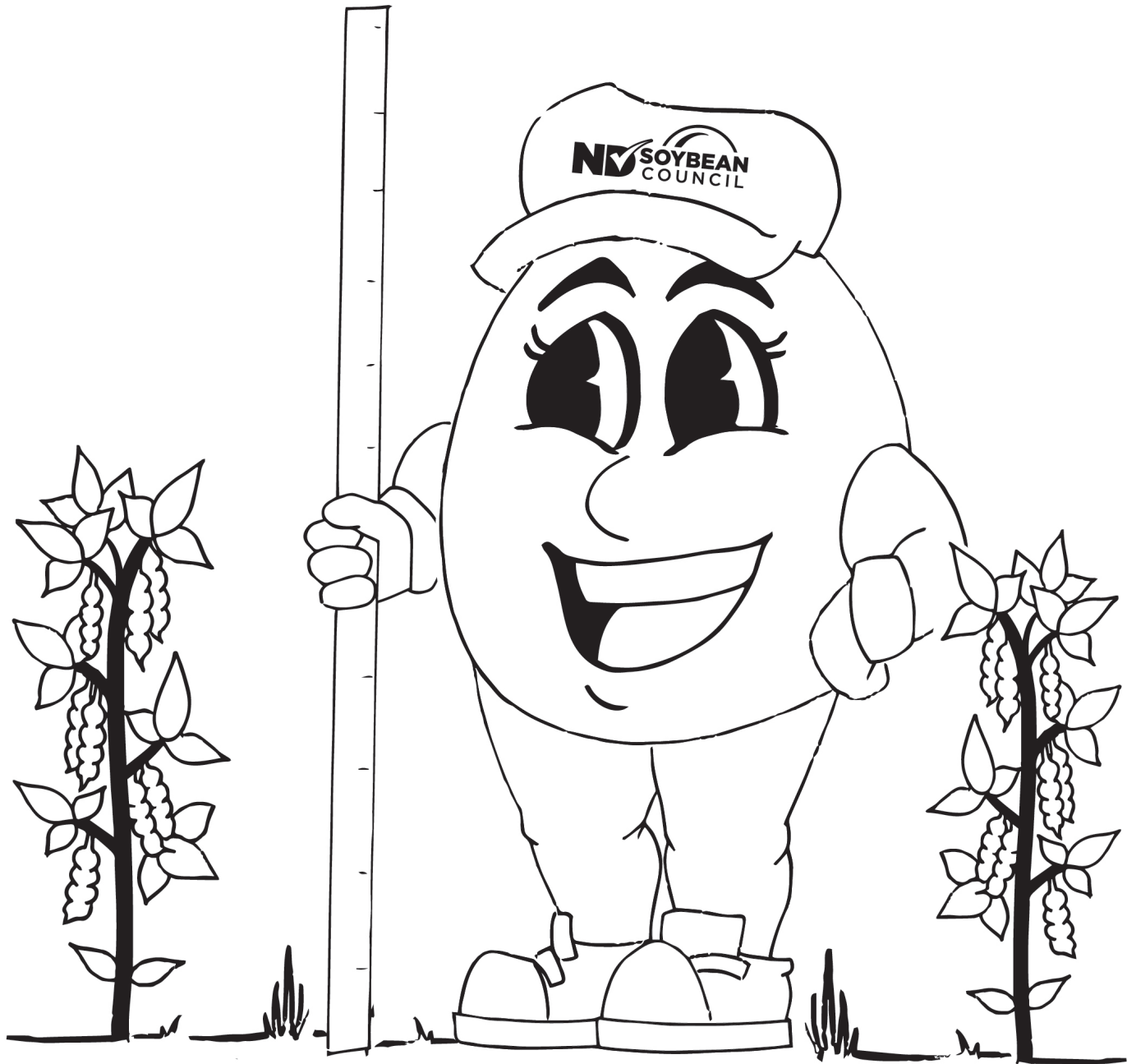
Suzie Soybean

In the Spring, farmers prepare their fields for planting.

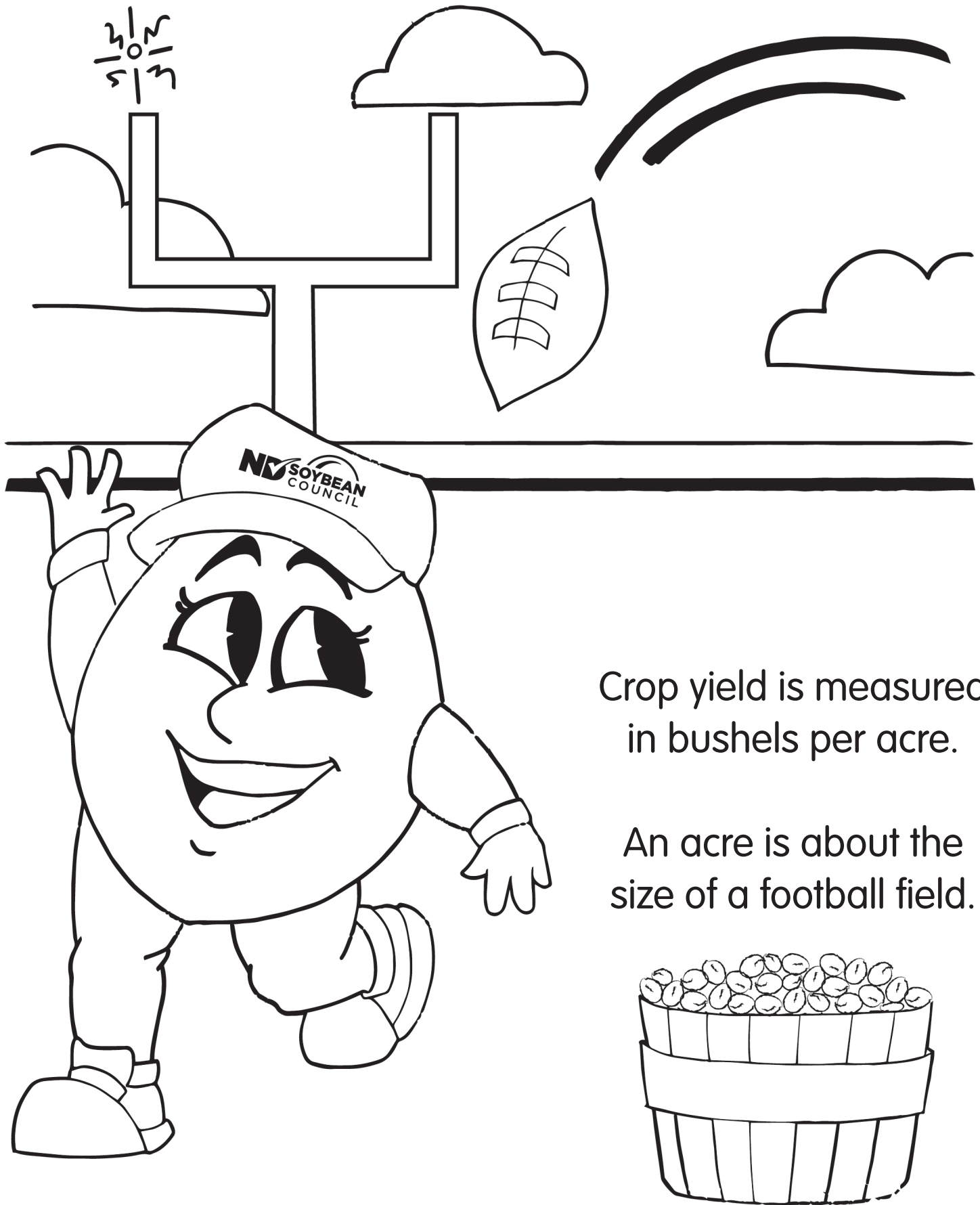


Circle what is needed for growing soybeans.

By Summer, soybeans grow taller.

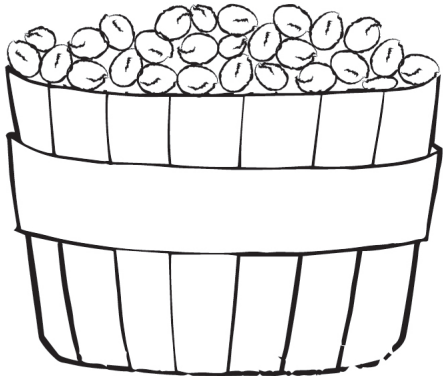


Farmers watch over their crops and soil all summer to make sure the crops grow and the soil is healthy.



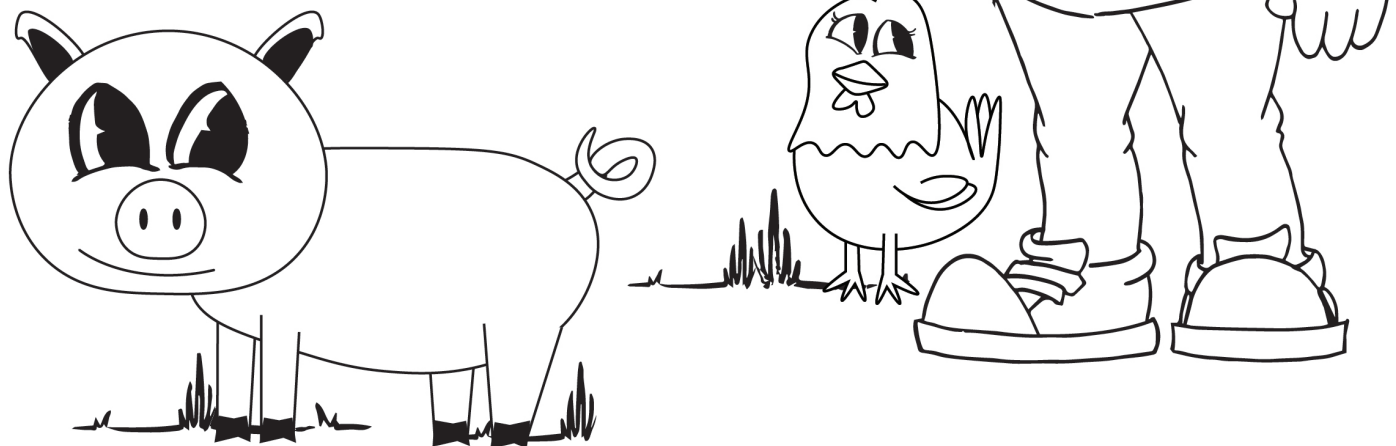
Crop yield is measured

size of a football field.



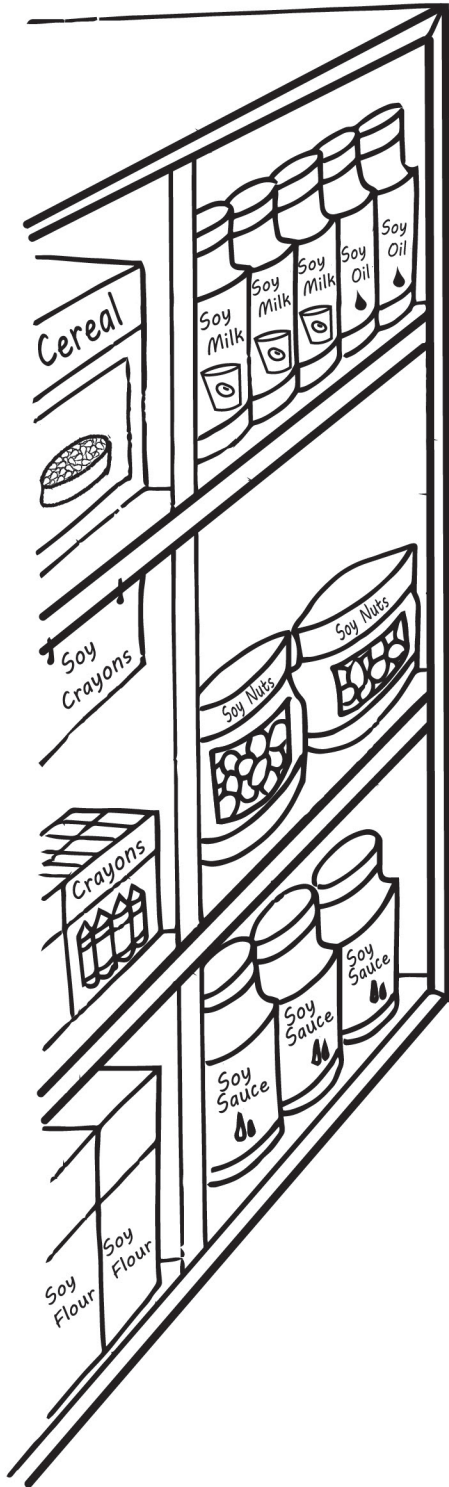


Did you know that animals, like dairy cows, pigs, and chickens, eat most of the soybeans grown in North Dakota?

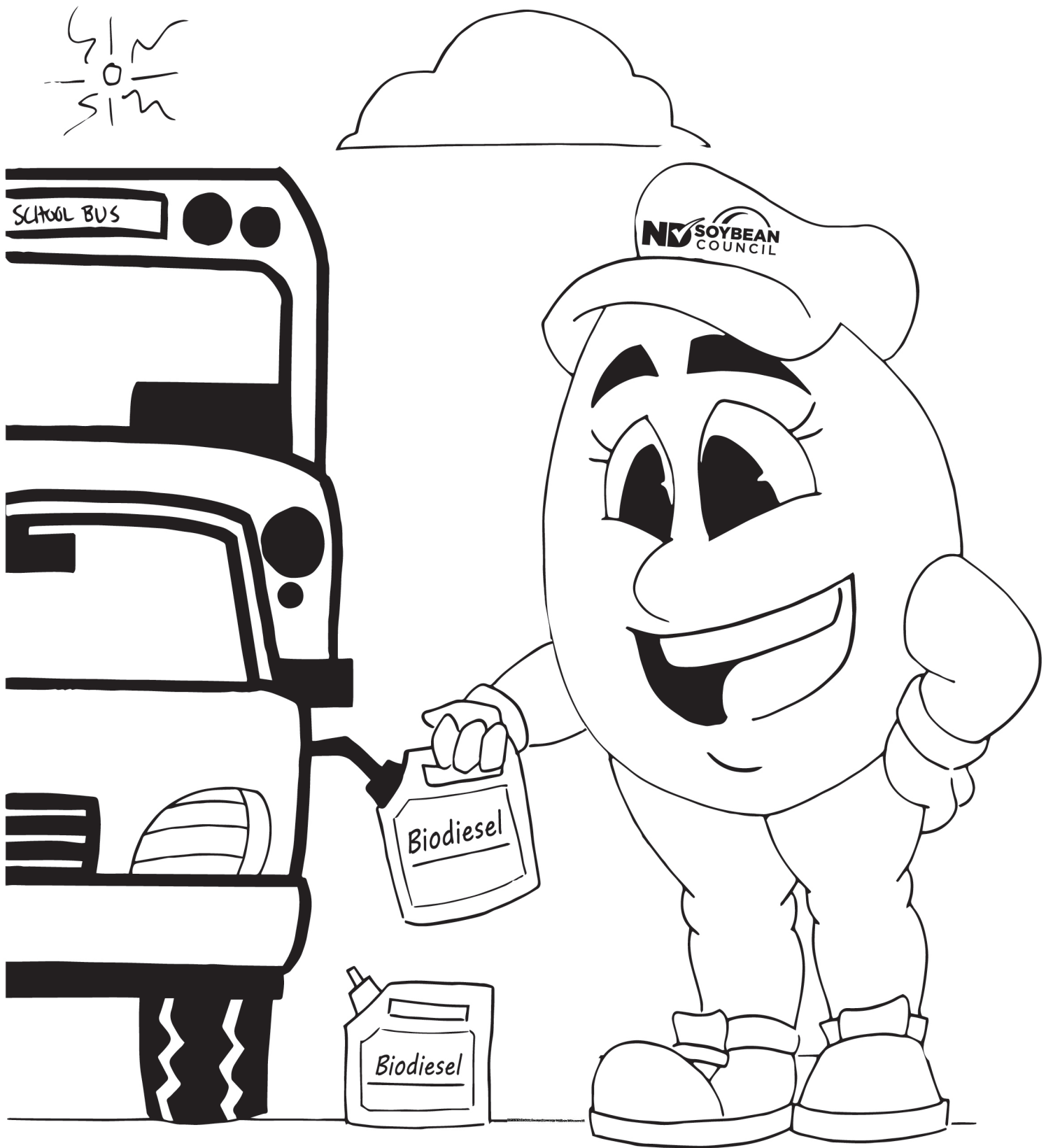

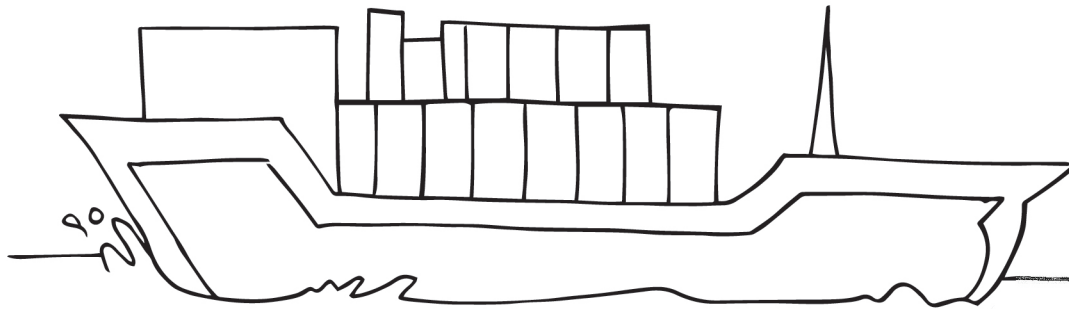
In the Fall, soybeans are ready for harvest.

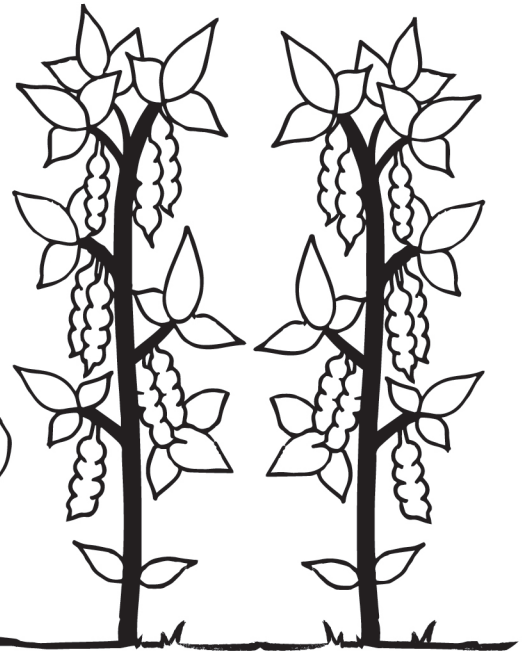
